What to Bring to Camp

The Most Important: A good attitude, Bible, notebook, pens, and pencils.

Clothes: Enough clothes for a week (no laundry service available), extra play shoes, socks, jeans, pants, shirts, underclothing, sweater or jacket, rainy-day wear, warm clothes for cold nights. A swimsuit in case swimming becomes available.

Personal Care Items: Towels, washcloths, tissues, toiletries (comb, toothbrush, toothpaste, soap, shampoo, deodorant, etc.)

FLASHLIGHT WITH EXTRA BATTERIES: there is no electricity in the cabins.

Bedding: Pillow, sheets & blankets or sleeping bag, (It can get down to the 30's at night!).

Other Stuff (if you want to): Camera/film, costumes for skits, musical instrument, mosquito repellent.

Sports Equipment (if you want to): Baseball glove, bat, ball, basketball, frisbees, soccer cleats, shin guards, board games.

Extra Money: Snack bar open daily,

What NOT to Bring to Camp

(If you have any questions, consult the local leadership of your church.)

Electronics: NO radios, iPods, mp3 players, cassette/CD players, portable TV's, electronic games, computers or PDA's, etc. These items may be used by faculty only for spiritual or administrative purposes. Cell phones to be used only for emergencies.

Immodest Clothes: NO shorts or skirts above the knee, tank tops, skimpy or tight-fitting clothing, "questionable" imprinted T-shirts, sundresses, etc.

Other Stuff: NO comic books, magazines, fireworks, firearms, knives, paintball guns, water guns, pets.
